

Secretary's Report as of May 1, 2024:

Sun City Lodge has 195 members.

Presently the Lodge has two Fellowcrafts, four Entered Apprentices, two petitioners for the degrees and two applicants for affiliation. That totals 10 new members in the "works"! This equals a potential membership of 205. Additionally, we have a bunch of prospective members interested in joining our Lodge, either by petition or affiliation!

The average age of our membership is 67.72 years old. The Fellowcrafts average 62.85 years old, the Entered Apprentices average 52.55 years old, the petitioners for the degrees average 47.34 years old and the applicants for affiliation average 50.32 years old.



Building Mangers Update

The following issues are presented for the attention of all organizations who use the Sun City Lodge Building:

• Topic / Item: Dining Room Configuration

Issue: Dining room set-up and tear down. The office has received comments from various groups that it is necessary to tear down before they can setup. Tables stacked on top of each other in the corner is not acceptable. Excessive tables are being left set up in dining room. Chairs being left set-up. All not acceptable.

Remedy: All organizations will return all tables and chairs that they use for their event to the proper storage areas.

Long tables are <u>NOT</u> to be left along the wall area (to the left of the entrance; and, between the maintenance and hall way) and in between the kitchen access doors.

Three of the long tables will be left at the entrance door in the dining room to block the chairs and give organizations a place for registering their membership / guests.

Six round tables with six chairs at each table to be placed in the left- hand corner of the dining room (Left of entrance).

The stage is to be left in position.

• Topic / Item: Lights left on

Issue: Organizations using the Masonic Building are <u>not</u> ensuring all lights in the building are turned off. (Hallways, bathrooms, storage rooms & Lodge Room)

Remedy: Person(s) responsible MUST ensure lights are off when closing up the building. This helps keep the building electricity usage at a minimum.

Topic / Item: Calendars

Issue: Masonic Center Calendars of events have been found strewn on the floor of the lobby. (Three times) **Remedy:** Calendar will now be posted on the Office window.

Topic / Item: Dining Room Floor

Issue: Dining Room and Carpeted areas require cleaning.

Remedy: Dining room and carpet areas to be cleaned April 30th. There will be NO scheduled events that day or evening.

• Topic / Item: Roof

Issue: Roof is in need of repair.

Remedy: New roof will be installed the week of April 12th. - Now complete

• Topic / Item: Building Trim and Porch areas

Issue: Building trim / porch areas require repair and painting.

Remedy: Building trim / porch areas to repaired and painted the week of April 15th.

Topic / Item: Water Faucet located behind Ice Machine

Issue: Water faucet stays on ...will not shut-off. **Remedy:** Removed / Repaired water faucet.

Topic / Item: Ceiling Lights

Issue: Numerous lights are not illuminating. **Remedy:** R/R Light bulbs. To be scheduled.

• Topic / Item: Bar Towels in main Kitchen

Issue: Old bar-towels were beyond cleaning due to age and misuse.

Remedy: Replaced bar-towels w/ 36 new bar-towels. These towels are not to be used to clean the floor or the grills.



Masonic Education for Outdoor Degrees: The Chuck Wagon was invented by Freemason Charles Goodnight in 1866, Bro. Col. Goodnight a Texas Ranger and Cattleman, along with his partner and friend, Bro. Oliver Loving, a rancher, rounded up stray cattle from all over Texas and herded the Doggies to Bro. John Chisum's Spread near Fort Sumner in the New Mexico Territory. This would become known as the Goodnight-Loving Trail, He needed a conveyance for their Grub along the trail and the Chuck Wagon was born. The Brothers were members of Phoenix Lodge No. 275 in Weatherford, Texas, and are portrayed in the book and talking picture show Lonesome Dove.


