I am also thankful for now Worshipful Brother Matthew Lawrence's heartfelt and gracious opening of the Lodge of Installation and for gifting each of us with a beautiful blue 'true' bow tie which, each time we wear it, will remind of us of the truly good and loving Brother he continues to be for all of us. Finally, I owe my wife, Anna, a debt of gratitude for her willingness to serve as 'Jewel Bestower pro tem' when called upon to perform that service.

In addition to the installation of the Line of Progression itself, it was my honor to formally appoint WB Barry White as Lodge Almoner and Brother Jerome Sinclair as Lodge Musician. Each was invested with the collar and jewel of his respective office. Our new Almoner, now formally recognized as an Officer, has been charged with attending to matters relating to the health of our members as broadly construed and, therefore, the overall well-being of our Lodge itself. By pursuing its particulars, Sun City Lodge #72 will be positioning itself for Master Architect recognition at the upcoming Grand Communication. Other domains and projects will concern themselves more specifically with things that our three principal Officers have already had under discussion for some while now. You will be hearing more about them as they come closer to fruition but each in its own way will strive to promote and operationalize our Masonic principles and values by encouraging active fellowship among us, involving our families and friends when and where it makes sense to do so and, very importantly, offering opportunities for having fun. On this last point, namely "fun," an effort is now underway to identify what your personal interests generally are so that they may considered as potential drivers for events and activities that will elicit your involvement with them. Such things will, of course, be open to all and we hope that many of you will choose to participate in them. To organize and make such things available, however, we need your input and for that reason I will be asking those of you who have not already done so to complete at our next Degree night or next Stated Meeting a brief questionnaire to assist us in our efforts. A brief note stating the things that, for you, have just been mentioned will be fully adequate.
