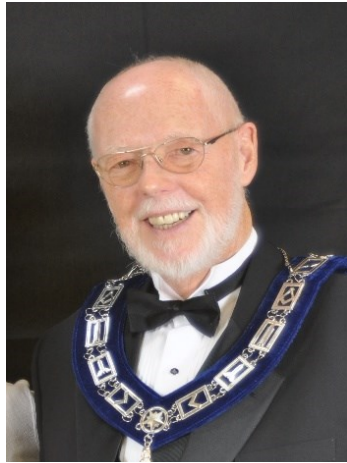

Arizona Masonic Charities has provided this agency with financial grant support for several years and is proud to be associated with the important work provided to the residents of Arizona.

Masonic Charities of Arizona is a non-profit organization whose objective is to channel contributions from Masons in Arizona to community social service agencies. To carry out this objective, Masonic Charities seeks grant applications from 501c3 charitable organization in Arizona. The Board seeks to coordinate donations with local Masonic Lodges and involve the local Masonic Lodge in the donation presentation. The Board of Directors is appointed to serve a three-year term by the Grand Master of Masons of Arizona. Directors serve voluntarily and receive no compensation for their services.

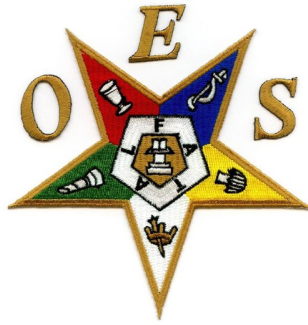
Oasis Chapter's Annual Outdoor Mark Master Degree conferral took place on Saturday 28 October 2023. Information about the conferral will be released in November.

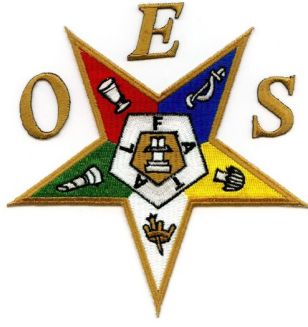

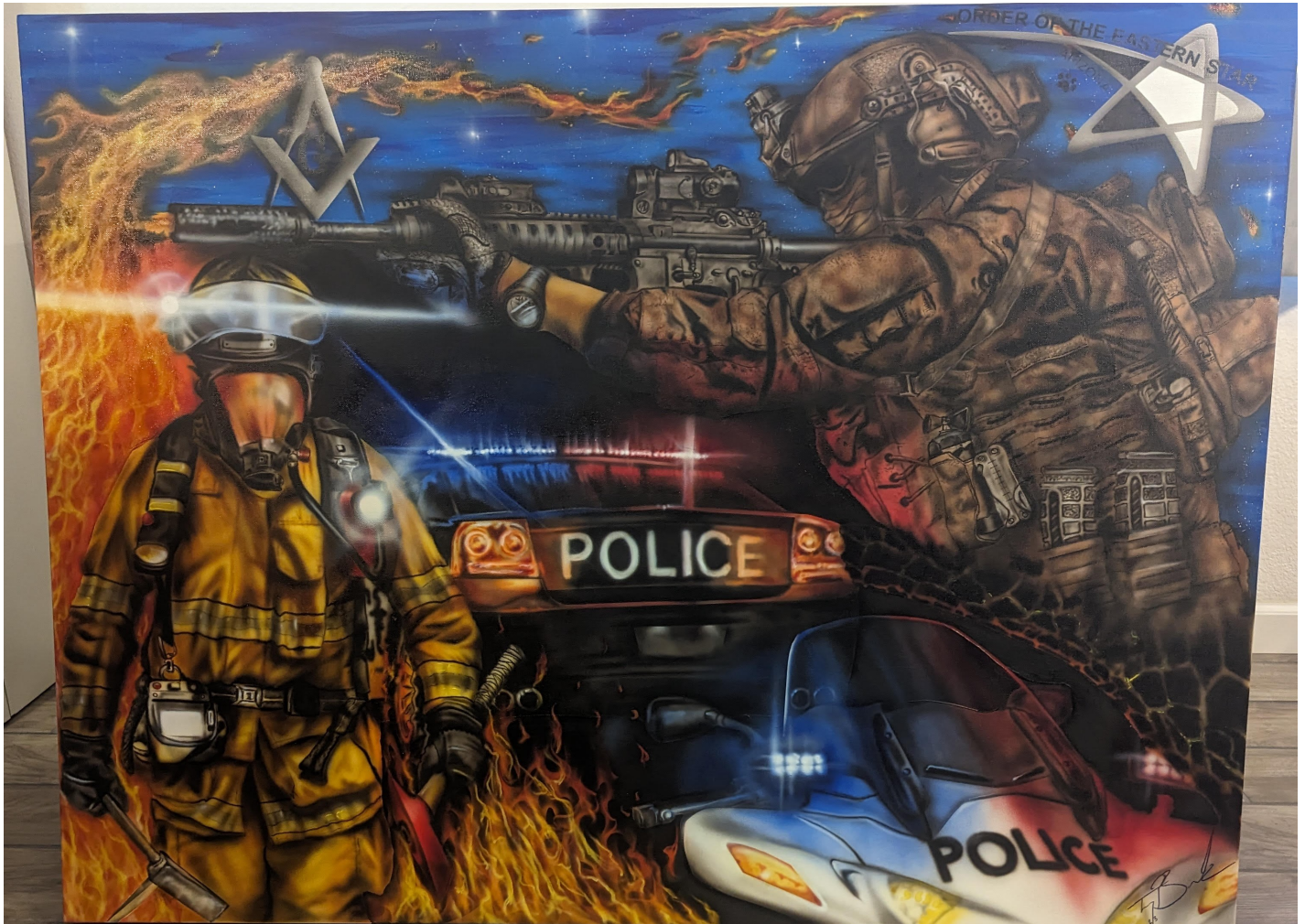
